PTI likely to be out ANP HDP to be part Balochistan coalition

Pakistan Tehrik e Insaf (PTI) is likely to be out of the Balochistan coalition government after Jamat ul Ulema e Islam (JUI) supremo Maulana Fazal ur Rehman put the former ruling party's ouster as a condition for joining the government.

"If we join the government then there has to be no PTI", a key lawmaker from the JUI F told Daily Quetta Voice. He requested anonymity. The religious party, which has 12 lawmakers in the house of 65 is all set to join the coalition government in Balochistan soon. The provincial amir of the JUI Maulana Abdul Wasey is expected to have a crucial meeting with Chief Minister Balochistan, Mir Qudus Bizenjo tomorrow (Friday).

"Maulana categorically told us that there should be no PTI", JUI lawmaker

"Maulana categorically told us that there should be no PTI", the lawmaker mentioned while quoting the religious party chief. He however said, "We have no objection over Awami National Party (ANP) and Hazara Democratic Party (HDP)".

The former ruling party has two ministers including Mir Naseebullah Marri and Mobeen Khilji and Sardar Babar Musakhail, the deputy speaker



of the Balochistan Assembly. The party's former provincial chief Sardar Yar Muhammad Rind has already distanced himself from party affairs a year ago.

Zamarak Achakzai of ANP and Khaliq Hazara of HDP are ministers

ANP's Zamarak Achakzai is the provincial minister and Malik Naeem Bazai, is the parliamentary secretary. However, Khaliq Hazara of the HDP is also a minister in the Chief Minister Mir Qudus Bizenjo-led cabinet. The two parties were also the allies of former CM Balochistan Jam Kamal Khan.

Differences surfaced within the ANP as its parliamentary leader Asghar Khan Achakzai stood by Jam Kamal Khan, the old ally when Mr. Bizenjo and opposition parties submitted a no-confidence motion. However, Zamarak Achakzai and Malik Naeem Bazai remained in the Bizenjo's camp to maintain their powers.

CM Bizenjo is expected to withdraw portfolios from two PTI ministers and some BAP ministers to accommodate the religious party in the coalition government. In this whole situation, there has been no word from the Balochistan National Party (Mengal), another key opposition party that supported Mr. Bizenjo against Jam Kamal Khan.

Reconciliation between CM Balochistan and Senator Manzoor Kakar

This development has also come a day before crucial talks between Jamiat ul Ulema e Islam (JUI) and CM Bizenjo about the religious party's intention to be part of the coalition government.

Govt to subsidise Panadol, Paracetamol: PM

WASHINGTON: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has said that the government would provide subsidy to the producers of Panadol and Paracetamol medicines to make them affordable for the people.

Shehbaz Sharif was chairing a Zoom meeting of the authorities concerned to review the pace of various flood relief and rehabilitation activities in the flood-hit areas across Pakistan on Wednesday.

Expressing his views, the prime minister apprised that today he held meetings with the president of World Bank and managing director International Monetary Fund and comprehensively discussed the flood situation in Pakistan. They expressed their grief over the losses and assured to extend all possible help and support Pakistan, he added.

The prime minister said that he had cautioned that millions of vulnerable children were deprived of essential food items and could fall ill with diseases like diarrhea.

Due to widespread devastation caused by floods, the people in Pakistan could not face the challenge alone with their limited resources, he said and urged the world community, international organizations like WB and IMF and other friendly countries to support them and provide the flood victims the much-needed relief.

The meeting was attended by Finance Minister Miftah Ismail, Information Minister Marriyum Aurangzeb, Advisor to Prime Minister Ahmad Cheema and other senior officers concerned.

Shehbaz Sharif is currently in New York to attend the high-level general debate of the 77th Session of UN General Assembly (UNGA77), sched-



uled from 20 to 26 September.

The prime minister reviewed the distribution of food items, tents and medicines in the affected areas. He ordered the authorities concerned to make use of all available resources to distribute essential food items, especially baby food in the affected areas on emergency basis.

He also took stock of the restoration of roads, rails, bridges and other infrastructure damaged in the devastating floods, and ordered the relevant federal and provincial departments to accelerate their efforts in order to make them operational as early as possible.

The prime minister, who is also the PML-N president, congratulated Ahsan Iqbal for his acquittal in a NAB case by Islamabad High Court. Terming it good news, the prime minister regretted that the previous government was involved in the witch-hunting of its opponents and tried to implicate them in false cases through awkward manner.

President of the World Bank David R Malpass has stressed that Pakistan should be prioritized for reconstruction through the collective support of the international community.

He was talking to Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in New York on the sidelines of the 77th session of the United Nations General Assembly. The President expressed sympathy and condolence over the damage and destruction caused by the flood. He also expressed the World Bank Group's willingness to help Pakistan in its reconstruction and rehabilitation efforts. He pledged to immediately re-disburse \$50 million dollars to help Pakistan in flood relief efforts. INP

UN chief wants 'action' to address climate loss, damage payments to Pakistan

NEW YORK: The United Nations chief said Wednesday it was time for "meaningful action" on the issue of compensation for damage wrought by the climate crisis, especially in developing countries like Pakistan.

Developing nations argue that historic polluters have a moral imperative to pay for the loss and damage, but the idea was shot down by rich nations at COP26, who offered only to start talking about the issue at COP27.
