Humiliating removal of 4 VCs in Balochistan

In a humiliating way, four vice-chancellors of public universities in Balochistan were removed by the Governor/Chancellor the other day. Although, violations of laws and rules are nothing new in Balochistan, the country's least-developed but resource-rich province.

Without any inquiry or investigation, the VCs of the University of Balochistan, Balochistan University of Information Technology Engineering and Management Sciences (BUIITEMS), Loralai University, and Lasbela Science and Marine University were removed from their positions.

Tenure of two VCs was about to expire

The sources within the Balochistan government cited the expiry of the tenure of the two VCs as the main reason behind the removal. However, the two VCs' tenure was scheduled to be expired in September and October this year.

What was the reason behind this haste? The answer is simple. We are still alien to rules and regulations and consider our mighty official, political and social positions above the law.

As per the Balochistan Universities Act 2022, the Governor has no power to remove VCs in such a way

As per the Balochistan Universities Act 2022, the government can initiate an investigation against any VC in the case of corruption/moral corruption or illegal use of power. The government can only remove the said VC if allegations are proven against him. The Act clearly says that the VC has to be given the opportunity to



defend himself against any allegations. **Whereas, Governor Malik Abdul Wali Kakar removed all with a stroke of a pen without any investigation**

Undoubtedly, there have to be no prolonged tenures of the VCs like Dr. Farooq Ahmed Bazzi remained the VC for 17 years of the BUIITEMS. He had to be changed. We have only an objection over the humiliating way, he was removed. There had to be a dignified and respectable way for the removal of VC who is also a teacher. Yes, there were allegations of nepotism and favouritism against Mr. Bazzi.

Question marks over the capacity/credibility of SBK for recruitment of teachers

No word from the government or Governor's house about the fate of VC Sardar Bahadur Khan (SBK) Women's University. There were repeated allegations against the VC SBK. Nevertheless, the VC SBK managed to meet the Governor and brief him about her university.

The SBK has also been given the task to recruit 9000 teachers. Repeated complaints came in the process of recruitment by candidates about the SBK. Most of the candidates are skeptical about the credibility of the SBK and demand the Balochistan Public Service Commission (BPSC) conduct the recruitment process. National Party, a key Baloch nationalist party has also demanded of the government to conduct tests and interviews through BPSC.

Teachers' posts should be given to the BPSC. No issue if agriculture posts are filled through departments or SBK. There has to be no compromise over the future of our children and the BPSC should be given the task to appoint teachers. Chief Minister Balochistan, Mir Qudus Bizenjo should also translate his words into action in this regard.

Protesters block road against gas load shedding in Quetta

QUETTA: Protesters blocked various roads of Quetta, the provincial capital against prolonged and unannounced gas load shedding on Friday. The protesters took to roads and burnt tires to vent their anger against the Sui Southern Gas Company (SSGC).

The residents of Qambrani road blocked the road and strongly criticized the SSGC for its failure to provide a gas supply to the consumers. "We are facing a lot of difficulties during this sacred month of Ramazan ul Mubarak", Muhammad Hashim, one of the aged protesters said. He said without any prior notice, the SSGC had stopped the gas supply to Qambrani road and other adjoining areas.

Protester chanted slogans against SSGC

The protesters chanted slogans against the SSGC and the provincial government and demanded immediate restoration of gas supply during the holy month of Ramazan ul Mubarak.

The worst traffic jam was observed as a result of the protest staged by the residents of the area against the SSGC officials. Long queues of vehicles were witnessed as a result of the protest.

CM Balochistan takes notice of gas load shedding in Quetta



Chief Minister Balochistan, Mir Qudus Bizenjo also took notice of the protest against low and no gas pressure in the city. Babar Yousafzai, the Spokesman for the CM Balochistan said that a message was also conveyed to the SSGC high-ups.

Since it is a federal department, therefore, we can only lodge a protest and ask them to restore the gas supply, Mr. Yousafzai said.

Senior administration officials reached the spot and reopened the road

Senior administration officials reached the main Dr. Nashnas Chowk where the road was blocked. They held successful negotiations with the protesters and they reopened the road for traffic.

SBK will not ensure merit in appointment of teachers: NP

QUETTA: The Central Spokesman National Party (NP) on Thursday said that the Sardar Bahadur Khan (SBK) Women's university would not ensure merit in the appointment of teachers.

In a statement issued here, the Baloch nationalist party has reservations and apprehensions about the process of recruitment through the SBK in the education department. "Posts are being sold", the Spokesman claimed. There was no immediate response from the education department and the government of Balochistan in this regard.

Unknown company minting money from unemployed youth

The spokesman of the National Party said that a fee of 1500 rupees has been fixed for each post, while 400 rupees have to be paid to the TCS company. While Sardar Bahadur Khan University has given the responsibility of investigating the documents to an unknown non-governmental organization.



The party spokesman said that more than two and a half lakh unemployed youth will submit minimum applications for the posts of the education department, which clearly means that Sardar Bahadur Khan Women's University will distribute billions of rupees to the unemployed youth with the collusion of the government and the education department.

BPSC has to recruit teachers

The party spokesman demand that the institution of Balochistan Public Service Commission has been established for the purpose of the Balochistan Public Service Commission to fill the vacant posts of education on the basis of merit.

It was said in the statement that if an attempt is made to distribute vacant posts in the education department through Sardar Bahadur Khan Women's University, then they will go to court against it and will not allow any abuse to the youth of Balochistan.

One of them is Sardar Bahadur Khan Women's University, which cannot conduct its examinations in a timely and transparent manner. Recruitment through such institutions is bribery. The aim is to push the unemployed youth towards despair by heating up the market, against which the National Party will raise its voice at every turn and conduct a movement throughout Balochistan.

Hassan Khan Niazi, Imran's nephew handed over to Quetta police

QUETTA: Hassan Khan Niazi, the nephew of the Pakistan Tehrik e Insaaf (PTI) Chief, Imran Khan was handed over to the Quetta Police on Friday. Mr. Niazi was handed over to the Quetta police after a judicial magistrate in Islamabad approved one-day transit remand of the latter. Police had taken Hassan Khan Niazi outside the judicial complex in Islamabad a few days back. Police sources had said that Niazi was apprehended in G-11 near the Judicial Complex for his involvement in attacking law enforcement personnel and causing chaos in the federal capital. The arrest is part of an ongoing crackdown on PTI activists and supporters who police claim assaulted law enforcers while they were performing their duties in Islamabad.

When contacted by the Daily Quetta Voice, senior police officials preferred not to share the details about Hassan Khan Niazi. Neither, they confirmed Niazi was in custody nor rejected the news.

Ziarat receives spring snowfall Balochistan bracing for more rains

Ziarat, Pakistan's famous tourist destination received spring's snowfall on Thursday. However, Quetta and other parts of Balochistan received heavy rainfall.

Tourists from across Balochistan thronged towards Ziarat to enjoy spring's first snowfall and the weather turned cold in the lush green valley. Balochistan's Secretary of Information, Hamza Shafiqat also took to the social media network Twitter and shared videos about the snowfall.

Ziarat hosts the world's second-largest juniper forest. Thousands of years old ancient juniper trees are now declared a world asset by UNESCO.

In Quetta, the provincial capital of Balochistan province, the citizens faced power outages and low and no gas supply. The



continued prolonged and unannounced gas load shedding prompted the Spokesman of Chief Minister Balochistan, Babar Yousafzai to lodge a protest against the Sui Southern Gas Company (SSGC).

SSGC criticized for its failure to provide gas supply to Quetta

"The SSGC is not under our control, it is a federal department", Mr. Yousafzai said. Especially, most parts of the city plunged into darkness after a heavy downpour.

The situation prompted the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) to hold an emergency meeting to tackle the situation. The Director-General of the PDMA, Naseer Ahmed Nasar chaired the meeting and issued directives to the concerned authorities to prepare for the snowfall and rainfall.

Gwadar fisherman lauds China donated Solar Systems amid power failures

Islamabad: Gwadar Fisherman have lauded China donated Solar Systems amid power failures, according to Gwadar Pro. "We no longer have a problem with power breakdowns as China's solar systems continue to provide service to the people of Gwadar," said Abdul Rashid, a fisherman and resident of the Gazarwaan area near Masjid-e-Aqsa in Gwadar's old city. Abdul Rashid is among the beneficiaries of a package of solar equipment that was donated by China in collaboration with the Chinese Embassy and the Ministry of Ecology and Environment. Last year, the initiative donated 4,000 sets of solar photovoltaic systems and LED lights. "Due to some technical issues a few days ago, there was an electricity outage in Gwadar for a week. In such a dire situation, my children were able to sleep peacefully for six nights because the solar set and battery donated by China provided 4 to 5 hours of power to keep the fan running," he added. Speaking to Gwadar Pro, Abdul Rashid shared how his family's life has improved since their home was solarized with a donation from

China's Ministry of Ecology and Environment in collaboration with the Chinese Embassy. He said, "Previously, during prolonged power outages, my sick mother used to suffer in the dark at night and was very uncomfortable. But for the past five months, thanks to solar power in our home, my mother has been cheerful and offering good wishes to China." He added that during the day, his wife can now use the washing machine and other electric appliances to do household chores thanks to solar power. When asked about the donation process, he said it was fair and transparent, except for one or two cases. The solar system has also helped keep their electricity bill in check, even during the price hikes in Ramadan. Regarding the verification process, he stated, "The authorities personally collected information and inquired with our neighbors to confirm our status as deserving recipients of the solar system." After the verification was completed, the authorities installed the solar system free of cost. Raheem Bukh, a social worker, informed Gwadar Pro that Chinese solar donations were distributed to the deserving local residents. INP

Several PTI leaders come under anti-corruption scrutiny

ISLAMABAD: Several PTI leaders including former MNA Ghulam Bibi Bharwana, Farrukh Habib, Amir Dogar, former provincial education minister Murad Raas, Waris Aziz, and Ali Akhtar have come on anti-corruption establishment's radar, it was learnt on Friday. According to details, the ACE detected a fraud in the possession of 50 acre government land in Chak 243 by the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's former member of National Assembly Ghulam Bibi Bharwana. The ACE spokesperson said that Bharwana did not submit fee for the 50 acre government land to the national treasury. He further revealed that PTI's former federal minister Farrukh Habib has established an illegal car stand at a government land. INP

Heroin recovered from parcel booked for London

LONDON: The Anti-Narcotics Force (ANF) seized 1 kg and 600 grams of cocaine at Bacha Khan International Airport from the trolley bag of a passenger coming from Doha to Peshawar. Separately, ANF officials raided a local courier office in Karachi and recovered 1 kg and 20 grams of heroin from a parcel booked for London. The recovered heroin was tactfully hidden in the gloves meanwhile a Karachi resident was arrested. Separate cases have been registered against accused. INP

Punjab CTD arrests five terrorists of banned outfit

LAHORE: The Punjab Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) arrested five terrorists of a banned organisation during an operation on Friday. According to the CTD officials, the operation was carried out on a tip-off in Gujranwala and Dera Ghazi Khan. The accused were identified as Abdul Muqet, Abid Waheed, Gul Zaman, Ramadan and Iqram Explosives, weapons and material for making suicide jackets were also recovered from them. The arrest of the terrorists was made possible through interrogation from 33 suspects. As many as 66 suspected persons were arrested in 420 combing operations during the ongoing week. "No effort will be spared to take the miscreants involved in terrorism to their logical end," the Punjab CTD vowed. INP

Four die in Karachi, Hafizabad road accidents

KARACHI, Hafizabad: Four people died while eight were injured in two different road accidents in Karachi and Wazirabad on Friday. In the first accident, a bus collided with a trawler near Lucky Cement Factory on Super Highway in Karachi, killing two people and leaving seven others injured. Rescue 1122 officials moved the injured to Abbasi Shaheed Hospital for medical assistance. In the other accident, two people were killed while a kid was injured when two motorcycles and a car collided near Khivewali area of Wazirabad. A woman and a man were among the dead. Rescue 1122 transferred the deceased and injured to THQ Hospital Wazirabad. INP

Court reserves ruling on Imran's plea seeking cancellation of warrants

ISLAMABAD: A local sessions court in Islamabad on Friday reserved his judgement on the petition seeking cancellation of arrest warrants against former prime minister and PTI Chairman Imran Khan in a judge three case. Additional Sessions Judge Faizan Haider Gilani heard the petition filed by the PTI chairman seeking annulment of his arrest warrants in the female judge three case. Earlier, the judge announced a break in the case hearing till 10:30am today when Imran's

lawyers did not show up. However, after the resumption of the hearing, the judge reserved his ruling on the petition. At the outset of the case proceedings, prosecutor Rizwan Abbasi pleaded with the court to bind Imran to appear before the court during next hearing. Judge Rana Mujahid Raheem issued non-bailable arrest warrants against Imran in the judge three case. However, the PTI chief filed a petition requesting the court to cancel warrants issued against him. INP

Banks to receive Hajj applications on Saturday, Sunday

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Friday announced that all designated bank branches will remain open on Saturday and Sunday (March 25 and 26) to facilitate intending pilgrims to deposit their application forms. The SBP announced to keep 14 banks open on Saturday and Sunday in order to accept Hajj applications. The announcement comes a day after the Ministry of Religious Affairs requested SBP to direct banks to remain open on Saturday and Sunday for Hajj applications. The last date for submitting Hajj applications is March 31. According to the religious ministry, as many as 26,000 applications were received under the regular Government

Hajj Scheme. For the convenience of Hajj applicants, the ministry for religious affairs directed banks to collect fitness certificates from overseas Pakistanis, adding that the overseas Pakistanis should make and submit the certificate before taking a Hajj flight. "Hajj applications can be submitted after receiving the first dose of one of the approved COVID vaccines," the ministry officials said. The officials termed it mandatory for the applicant to complete the dose of the COVID vaccines and submit the certificate in the bank before departure. "Apart from NADRA, foreign vaccine certificate will also be acceptable," the ministry official said. INP

Rasheed seeks treason case against coalition govt over delay in polls

RAWALPINDI: Awami Muslim League (AML) chief Sheikh Rasheed Ahmed on Friday called for initiating treason case under Article 6 of the Constitution against the members of ruling coalition for delaying elections in Punjab. In a series of tweets, the former interior minister said the PTI had dissolved assemblies in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa so elections could be held in 90 days. "Article 6 should be imposed on the occupant group in a week otherwise, anything can happen in the country," he wrote. He hoped that there would be clarity on the constitutional crisis created by the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) by Monday, adding that the PML-N was not interested in holding elections even in October as it was afraid of public. "Where will the money come from for elections in October when its not available in

April?" he questioned. "First, the country collapses economically and politically and then breaks apart," the AML chief warned. Lashing out at the "inexperienced" members of the government, he said the rulers had funds for their political luxuries but not for the elections. Mr Ahmed said he would meet PTI chief Imran Khan at his Zaman Park residence today. He said Imran Khan was being offered grand political dialogue but, at the same time, arrests were being made and hurdles created in PTI's gathering at Minar-e-Pakistan. Saying the IMF deal and poverty were not their priorities, he said the government was afraid of clean sweep by Imran Khan in coming elections. "A major legal battle is about to start," he said as the PTI decided to challenge the ECP move to postpone elections in Punjab for more than five months. INP

Sardarzada Sami Langove injured, wife killed in Mangochar attack

KALAT: Unknown accused opened fire and injured Sardarzada Samiullah Langove and killed his wife in Balochistan's Mangochar area on Friday. Levies sources said the armed accused opened fire at the vehicle of Sardarzada Samiullah Langove near Mangochar. Mr. Langove was injured in the attack. However, his wife was killed on the spot. The attackers escaped unhurt from the spot. Levies personnel reached the spot and shifted Samiullah Langove to a nearby hospital for medical treatment.



The dead body of his wife was also shifted to the hospital. The local administration launched an investigation into the incident. The motive behind the attack could not be ascertained immediately.

Thundershowers hit many parts of country

ISLAMABAD: Rain soaked different cities of the country including Lahore turning weather pleasant on Friday. However, the heavy downpour is damaging the ready wheat crop grown in these areas. The rain poured down in many areas of the country including Lahore, Darya Pur, Uch Sharif, Haroonabad, Shujabad, Ringpur and other cities. As the downpour hit Darya Pur, the electricity was gone in the area creating problems for the citizens. The low-lying areas were completely inundated in the city. Several MEPCO feeders also got tripped in Manchanabad. Due to incessant rain in Chak 170 in Layyah, a 40 feet breach occurred in Bhagal Minor. After the breach, the water entered the fields where wheat crop was ready. On getting information about the breach, the irrigation department teams reached there and started operation thus saving the standing ready crop from being destroyed. Heavy downpour lashed Uch Sharif, Dhor Kot, Khairpur Dhaha, Trund Basharat, Heed Panjand, Nabi Pur, Bait Bakhtari, Mastoi, Tahir Wali and Chani Goth. According to agriculture experts, the recent rains are detrimental to the ready wheat crop. They fear shortage in the average wheat production due to torrential rains. In Rangpur, the heavy rain coupled with thunderstorm has been continued for the last three hours. The rain is also damaging the ready wheat crop in the area. The electricity in both rural and urban areas of

Rangpur has also been suspended due to rain. According to the meteorological department report, there are chances of rain with strong winds/wind and thunder in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Islamabad, Punjab, North Balochistan, Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan on Friday. Meanwhile, hailstorm is also expected at few places and heavy rain is likely to pour in some areas in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and North Balochistan. Weather during last 24 hours in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Balochistan, Punjab and Sindh witnessed thundershowers at some places. Partly cloudy/cloudy conditions were reported in other parts of the country. Govt ready to hold comprehensive dialogue on all issues: Asif

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Defence Khawaja Muhammad Asif has stated that the government is ready to hold comprehensive dialogue for the sake of the country covering all the issues, but engaging in transactional dialogue will be a waste of time. Briefing the foreign media along with Minister for Information and Broadcasting Marriyum Aurangzeb in Islamabad on Friday about prevailing political situation in the country, he said Imran Khan has not offered materially anything for negotiations with the coalition government. The Minister said Imran Khan is a desperate man and believes in violence, which he demonstrated during the last week, which was never happened even in the history of Pakistan. He said during

the past few days, the constitution was undermined and violated. He said we are handling the crisis precipitated by Imran Khan on daily basis. Khawaj Asif expressed the confidence that the government would come out of the prevailing situation successfully including from the economic front. Regarding allegations of Imran Khan being levelled on some personalities about killing him, the Defence Minister said these are baseless with no reality. Replying to another question, he said holding elections is sole responsibility of the Election Commission of Pakistan. However, the security situation in the country has deteriorated and the Finance Ministry has not enough funds to hold elections separately. So, the Election Commission decided. INP

Only 13 Pakistani varsities make it to world university rankings

ISLAMABAD: At least 13 Pakistani universities have made it to the QS (Quacquarelli Symonds) World subject rankings for 2023. According to the latest QS ranking data, Quaid-i-Azam University was ranked between 151-200 in the subject of Statistics & Operational Research while LUMS was ranked between 301-350 in the subject of Law & Legal Studies. In Engineering & Technology, the National University of Science and Technology (NUST) was ranked at 160, COMSAT University Islamabad at 267, University of Engineering and Technology (UET) at 279, Quaid-i-Azam University Islamabad at 348, Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS) between 401-450 and the University of Punjab was ranked among 501-530. In the subject of Computer Science and Information Systems, NUST was ranked at 148, COMSAT University Islamabad

between 251-300, LUMS, National University of Computer and Emerging Sciences, and Quaid-i-Azam University Islamabad between 351-400, the UET between 401-450 and the University of Punjab among 451-500. Aga Khan University Karachi was ranked 391 in the subject of Life Sciences & Medicine while in the subject of Natural Sciences, Quaid-i-Azam University Islamabad was ranked at 346, COMSAT University Islamabad and NUST were ranked between 451-500. Dow University was ranked 601-650 in Medicine in the QS World Ranking. In Business & Management Studies, LUMS was ranked at 151-200, NUST between 251-300, Institute of Business Administration (IBA) between 301-350, COMSATS University between 401-450, University of the Punjab between 401-450, Quaid-i-Azam University between 451-500 and Iqra University between 551-580. Need stressed to make EPZs more independent

ISLAMABAD: Export Processing Zones (EPZs) play a vital role in promoting trade activities as they help accelerate the pace of industrialisation in a country. In Pakistan, EPZs could be made more productive if they are allowed to issue Statutory Regulatory Orders (SROs) for the export cargo instead of having the process done at the Karachi Export Processing Zone (KEPZ). An SRO is the final stamp of goods verification, after which a cargo shipment is allowed for export. Discussing with WealthPK the issue of the SRO regulation, Tajamul Hussain Sachal, the public relation officer of the Sialkot Chamber of Commerce and Industry (SCCI), said an EPZ should be allowed to operationalise SROs to make the exporters comfortable in shipping out their products. However, he said exporters had to take their shipping consignments to KEPZ for being issued an SRO. This was done at the great cost of paying more freight charges and sustaining other additional costs like direct and indirect labour, repackaging, warehouse

charges, etc. "Exporters are troubled a lot as all SROs and standing orders are issued only in the name of KEPZ rather than through an EPZ. The government should resolve this issue on a priority to facilitate trade and business activities." Tajamul Sachal said the other important issue was the appointment of trained and experienced staff in EPZs, who could efficiently handle the inbound and outbound shipments. "The staff should have the proper knowledge and skills concerning export processing and customs laws." Talking to WealthPK, Shabnam Asif, an exporter of leather shoes from Sialkot, said SCCI recommendations were needed to be considered for speedy processing of export shipments. "Taking an export consignment to Karachi for further processing is cumbersome and worrying for exporters. It also increases the exporters' expenses, and cargo handling becomes a problem in this way. During the last three to four months, most exporters missed the cargo ships because of the delay in goods processing at KEPZ due to the workload." INP
