QUETTA: The Balochistan High Court (BHC) declared the appointment of 32 coordinators and two spokespersons to Chief Minister Balochistan as illegal and null and void. A division bench of the BHC comprising Chief Justice, Mr. Justice, Naeem Akhtar Afghan, and Mr. Justice Amir Rana passed this order on a constitutional petition.

Senior lawyer, Sadiq Khilji Advocate, and others had challenged the appointment of the coordinators and two spokespersons to the CM Balochistan in the high court. The spokespersons include Farah Azeem Shah and Babar Yousafzai.



The court directed the sacked coordinators and spokespersons to submit all officials belonging to the Services and General Administration Department (S&GAD). All 32 coordinators and spokespersons should return all official belongings to the government, the court ordered.

In his petition, Mr. Khilji argued that the province was facing a serious financial crisis. Despite a serious financial crisis, Chief Minister Balochistan had appointed 32 coordinators and two spokespersons.

Police reached the spot and cordoned off the area to investigate the incident. The motive behind the attack could not be ascertained immediately.

PML-N did not suggest Dar's name for slot of interim premier: minister

In an interview with a local TV channel on Wednesday, the security czar rejected reports that the ruling Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) suggested the name of



Dar for the slot of the interim premier. However, the federal minister said if a politician is to be appointed as caretaker prime minister then there is nothing wrong in the name of Ishaq Dar. When asked why any politician should be appointed as caretaker prime minister and not any technocrat, retired bureaucrat or retired judge...

...as naturally a name like this [Dar] would emerge for [caretaker PM], he added. Politicians, he said, from other parties can also be nominated for the slot of interim prime minister. "From the PPP, Raza Rabbani's name can be picked," he added.

Sanaullah's statement comes as mainstream media quoted the ruling insiders as saying that the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) — a major partner in the ruling alliance — has decided to pick Dar as the caretaker PM. Following criticism that the finance minister's appointment as caretaker PM would raise questions over the neutrality of the interim setup, the PML-N leaders rejected the media reports. Punjab's top officials to 'go without pay' for not producing Parvez Elahi in court

Irked by non-compliance with orders, Lahore's Special Court (Central) on Wednesday directed the finance ministry to stop the salaries of the Punjab inspector general of police (IGP), IG prision and the home secretary for not producing Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) President Chaudhry Parvez Elahi before it.



Local court Judge Bakht Fakhar Bahzad issued the orders while issuing a money laundering case filed against the former Punjab chief minister. Besides stopping the salaries of the top officials, the court also slapped a fine of

Rs50,000 on each of the officers. In addition to this, the court served show-cause notices on the trio and directed them to submit their reply on August 5. Expressing its annoyance, the court observed that it was incomprehensible how the state shows negligence over keeping a person in prison without producing them in court. In his written order, the judge expressed his anger, saying how the authorities dared to shift a suspect who was in judicial custody without the permission of the court. Election Act amended to grant additional powers to interim set-up

A joint session of the Parliament on Wednesday passed amendments to the Election Act 2017, granting the caretaker government powers to take actions or decisions regarding existing bilateral or multilateral agreements and projects.

The Elections (Amendment) Bill, 2023, was presented by Parliamentary Affairs Minister Murtaza Javed Abbasi.

The PML-N had on Sunday announced that an amendment was being introduced to empower the interim setup to have powers similar to that of an elected government.

"The interim setup will not be confined to day-to-day affairs of the government till elections are held. An amendment is being brought to (the Constitution) to empower the caretaker government to take important decisions like an elected government does," PML-N supreme leader's spokesperson Muhammad Zubair earlier told Dawn.

The amendment is among several others being proposed to the elections laws ahead of polls scheduled to take place later this year.

However, during a joint session of the Parliament a day earlier, objections were raised to the amendment after which it was deferred for a day.

When the session resumed today, Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarar said



the government had prepared a new draft of the said amendment after concerns were raised by the allies and opposition members.

"Apart from Section 230, there was 100 per cent consensus on all the other amendments," he said. Tarar clarified that while it was being said that the amendment to Section 230 was made a day earlier, "the truth is that the changes were proposed five days back via WhatsApp and email" to members of the Parliament's Committee on Electoral Reforms. "But the committee was called again today and examined the amendment to Section 230 again," he said, adding that the members of the committee deemed the changes "unnecessary." Tarar further said that a new draft of the amendment, to simplify Section 230, had been shared by Commerce Minister Naveed Qamar. "Rest of the amendments that have been circulated are those on which there is 100pc consensus." The draft of the law, a copy of which is available with Dawn.com, said. "Provided that sub-sections 1 and 2 shall not apply where the caretaker government has to take actions or decisions regarding existing bilateral or multilateral agreements or the projects already initiated under the Public Private Partnership Authority Act 2017, the Inter-Governmental Commercial Transactions Act 2022, and the Privatisation Commission Ordinance 2000." Multivariate Aspects of Climate Change in Pakistan

32 coordinators to CM Balochistan

In less than a year, Chief Minister Balochistan Mir Qudus Bizenjo has appointed 31 coordinators. The appointment of a further three coordinators is in the pipeline. In all notifications, the Services, and General Administration Department (S&GAD) said the coordinators were appointed on an 'honorary' basis.

Temporary or paid, coordinators are a burden on the province facing a serious financial crisis and hardly maintaining the fragile financial condition. Chief Minister Balochistan has already appointed all 14 provincial ministers, and 5 advisers as per the 18th constitutional amendment. The question arises, what is the need for new recruitment of a crowd of coordinators? The answer is simple, this is just an attempt to please well-wishers and influential.

Offices along the same coordinators

Although, the government claims to have appointed them on an honorary basis, moreover, some of the coordinators have been allotted offices. Who pays for the staff and accommodation given to the coordinators? Administration provides them with security, whenever they roam across the province. Unnecessary protocols and security have already disturbed the routine life of the people across Balochistan. When the government removed check posts on highways throughout the province, people appreciated this step taken by Chief Minister Mir Qudus Bizenjo.

Friendly opposition should also play a role in ensuring financial discipline

Given Balochistan's serious financial crisis, the coalition government coupled with the friendly and powerful opposition must ensure financial discipline. The government should increase the development budget to improve the socioeconomic condition of the people.

The province is lagging behind all other provinces in terms of key social indicators including education, health, sanitation, clean drinking water, etc. The government has to focus on improving governance and reducing non-development expenditures rather than appointing coordinators on a mere political basis.

Climate change steams, unbecomingly challenges in the future. According to the World Bank report, Pakistan stands 6th in affluence of climate change. The awful and deadly floods of 2010, and 2011, extremely dry weather in a rainy area, and fluctuation in actual climate pattern is alarming and despairing signs among all the dwellers of the town.

Water resources and Agriculture in Pakistan In addition, Pakistan is a semi-arid country. The northern Aral Sea and Indus, Chenab, Ravi, and the Sutlej rivers flow through this area. Within the water calculus, the country's entire agriculture is dependant on water flow from the Indus river. Glacial flood out-

burst also poses a serious more attention on the country's climate in the Karakoram range. The sole aim was reaching and understanding the possible future result caused by glaciers, which are characterized by unsteady movements and frequent frontal advances of glaciers. After meaningful analysis, it revealed that the period between 1998 and 2002 generated 6 GLOFs.

Damages by Climate Change: Meanwhile, rigorous critical exploration of the Attabad Lake of Hunza Valley in Gilgit-Baltistan is the distinctive event that has drawn attention to threats of climate change in the center of freshwater. The lake flooding displaced more than

6,000 people from upstream villages and inundated over 19 kilometers of the Karakoram Highway. Recently, global warming and subsequent climate change have increased the constant state of fear and the risk of massive outburst flooding in the respective mountainous region. The comprehensive field evidence, local testimonies by the natives, modern applications of remote sensing, and cross-correlation face the scale future threat.

It is also noted, historically, in the Karakoram Range 39 glaciers are responsible for providing information. On the other hand, 36 glaciers build ice barriers in the running rivers due to frontal

advance, near to the densely populated areas in the Karakoram region. By constant observation of the prevailing and growing threat of climate change, it is airing the endless future threat only due to the GLOFs. For instance, the Indus River System (IRS) in the Indus basin, the ice-dam formation due to the GLOFs will slow down the water flowing pace downstream. And could raise a deep impact among the units for water distribution formula. In the end, it will ultimately surface the challenge of food insecurity in Pakistan.

The Karakoram Range, more importantly, is the home of the world's longest Belt One Road Initiative (OBOR) by giving with a potential corridor through the Karakoram

Highway from Karachi to the seaport at Gawadar in Balochistan (CPEC) on the Indian Ocean. Therefore, the smooth running of the traffic on the roads is the keynote for progressive economic development. While the ice barriers in rivers due to frontal advance could inundate the black-tops of the Karakoram Highway. The dislocation and Pakistan's roads will give birth to never-ending challenges due to the factor of GLOFs.

Sanitation System in Quetta

Quetta is the capital city of Balochistan, province of the Republic of Pakistan. It is located at an altitude of 1,680 m above sea level. The Bolan and Khojak passes on the route to Afghanistan. The town and suburbs have grown tremendously in the last 20 years, and hold nearly an estimated population of 1.2 million. Inadequate waste and solid waste disposal, storm water drainage and flood control system, and the existing water and sewerage resources as well as the deteriorating environment. Sanitation refers to public health conditions related to clean drinking water and #39; treatment and disposal of human excreta and sewage. Preventing human contact with faecal matter, such as is hand washing with soap. Sanitation systems are designed to protect human health by providing a clean environment that will stop the transmission of disease-causing organisms through the fecal route. For example, diarrhoea, cholera, typhoid, and malnutrition and stunted growth in children, can be reduced through proper sanitation.

The unpleasant smell of the sewage water and the unsanitary conditions in the streets, which are dumped into the drains daily has fully choked the already ineffective sewerage system. Sariab Road, Sabzal Road, Grewal Road, Mianmin Road, Kasi Road, Mizan Chowk, Prince Road, Mulla Chowk, Wahid Colony and Nawab Killi were among the areas where sewage water had accumulated due to choking of the drainage system. Only a few areas like Satellite Town, Shahbaz Town, Imnaha, and the Metropolitan team's and Town were established with some planning. There are 315 slums and underserved areas located in 44% of the 50 Union Councils. Only 57% slums are not found in any of the government schemes. The estimated population of which 35% lives in slums and underserved areas. 13% residents of these slums are displaced either in the province or are of other nationalities (mostly Afghans). The provincial capital of Balochistan, Quetta, has over 700 tons of solid waste generated daily. The administration is only capable of disposing of 200 tons of waste. The rest of the sewage means in the area, while some of the nationalities (mostly Afghans) are growing vegetables. As the sewerage system is clogged, dirt, refuse and animal manure are scattered on the streets. People find it difficult to walk in most areas like Mikangi Road, Imdad Chowk, Mission Chowk, Gwalmandi Chowk, Brown and

Quara where the water is accumulated. On one side the tall claims of sewerage system, while on the other the dirty water on the roads makes the life of shop owners and residents miserable. People have demanded that Metropolitan officials to get the sewerage system cleaned. The dirty water accumulated on the roads has laid bare the Metropolitan team's and the authorities' tall claims about cleanliness. The garbage lying by the roadside also caused health hazards for the people. So the suggested solution is to stop producing chemicals and waste into the environment. Improve sanitation and use appropriate and best hygiene practices. Reducing the number of displaced people, increasing the number of people with access to basic sanitation facilities and the amount of fecal waste generated and treated on-site, or collected, transported and treated. SC rejects Imran Khan's plea for stay on trial in Toshakhana criminal case

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court has turned down the request of PTI Chairman Imran Khan for issuing a stay order on the trial against him in Toshakhana criminal case.

It ruled that it was asking the high court to decide Imran Khan's appeal and other applications together. The court maintained that it would not be proper to interfere with the proceedings of the trial court.

The election commission's lawyer said the high court had reminded the case back to the trial court, which conducted a re-trial and declared the case maintainable.

Amjad Pervaiz said the PTI chairman was challenging the declaration of maintainability of the case against the high court.

This re-appeal in the high court is scheduled for hearing tomorrow, the lawyer told the Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court had earlier called the election commission's officer to the rostrum and told him that he will be heard today and a decision announced.

The SC had issued a notice to the Election Commission of Pakistan on Imran Khan's appeal.

A division bench of the Supreme Court headed by Justice Yahya Afridi conducted the hearing.

Imran Khan's lawyer Khawaja Harris said their request was to transfer the case to another judge.

"We also challenged the jurisdiction of the court," he remarked, adding the high court did not decide the case.

Justice Afridi said the matter of jurisdiction should have been decided first.

"We will request the high court to decide all the applications together," he remarked.

Khawaja Harris told the SC that today the trial court has called his client for recording a statement under Section 342, and requested for staying the trial in the case for just today.

"We are referring your case to the Islamabad High Court," Justice Musarrat Hilali said, asking, "How do you issue directions to the trial court?"

Earlier, the court expressed concern over the commotion outside the courtroom before the hearing started.

Justice Afridi sent Khawaja Harris to check the situation.

"We cannot hear the case like this," Justice Afridi remarked, adding everyone is responsible for respecting the court.

He added that ensuring respect for the justice is the responsibility of the lawyer and petitioner. INP

Cabinet approves E-Safety, Personal Data Protection Bills 2023

ISLAMABAD: The federal cabinet on Wednesday approved the E-Safety Bill 2023 (E-Safety Bill 2023) on the recommendation of the Ministry of Information Technology and to protect user data and prevent illegal use of information systems.

Under this law, a comprehensive framework will be established to ensure the protection and unauthorised use of user data on all types of online services, online shopping, data provided to various companies, and social networking websites in Pakistan. After the enactment of the bill, the protection of user information, cyberbullying, and blackmail will be effectively prevented.

The meeting of the cabinet was held here with Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif in chair.

The federal cabinet also approved in principle the Personal Data Protection Bill 2023 on the recommendation of the Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunication.

Under this bill, the government will ensure the security of the user's personal information/data of various organizations and companies and prohibit sharing of the user's information/data with any company, individual, or government organization without their permission.

Under the law, the National Commission for Personal Data Protection (NCPDP) will be established which will act as a civil court to protect the private documents/data of the users and redress the grievances of the complainants.

The federal cabinet also gave assent to the draft amendment bill of the Investment Board Ordinance 2001 for the promotion of foreign investment in Pakistan.

The amendment will empower the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC) as well as lay down its basic structure, working procedures, and use of user data on all types of online services, online shopping, data provided to various companies, and social networking websites in Pakistan. After the law is passed, the SIFC will ensure the speedy implementation of foreign investment projects in the country.

PM Shehbaz said the government was implementing the White Paper on Policy to promote Foreign Direct Investment in the country.

The policy would help expedite the implementation process of the projects under foreign investment.

The prime minister appreciated the Ministry of State for Petroleum Dr Musadik Malik for his successful efforts in finalizing the Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) agreement with Azerbaijan.

"This agreement is not only an important step forward to promote bilateral trade ties with Azerbaijan but it will also prove to be a milestone for the energy security of Pakistan," he added.

The federal cabinet, on the recommendation of the Ministry of Anti-Narcotics, established a ministerial committee under the chairmanship of Federal Minister for Defense Khawaja Muhammad Asif to finalize the contents of the National Cannabis Policy. INP

Rs30b loans distributed under PMYB&ALS in five months: SAPM

KARACHI: Special Assistant to Prime Minister (SAPM) on Youth Affairs Shazia Fatima Khawaja on Wednesday said under the Prime Minister's Youth Business and Agriculture Loan Scheme (PMYB&ALS), the loans of 30 billion rupees were distributed during the last five months.
