Unlike other major cities in Pakistan, Quetta lacks an organized public transport system. With no buses or mass transit options, residents rely on rickshaws,

Over 50,000 rick-shaws operate within the city, creating congestion in already packed areas like Masjid Road and Liaquat Bazzar (Traffic Survey: Quetta Smart and Safe City, 2023).
