Over 100 dead as Punjab reels from devastating floods

PM and COAS Asim Munir Visit Bannu, Vow Strong Response Against Terrorism

News Desk:

BANNU: In an important development, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Field Marshal General Syed Asim Munir visited Bannu.

According to security sources, the Prime Minister and the Field Marshal attended an important high-level meeting on counterterrorism. They also participated in the funeral prayers of 12 brave martyrs of the South Waziristan operation.

The Prime Minister reaffirmed that terrorism will continue to be met with a strong response, and no ambiguity will be tolerated in this regard.

Security sources stated that the masterminds and facilitators of terrorism in Pakistan are based in Afghanistan and are being supported by India.

The Prime Minister made it clear to Afghanistan that it must choose between supporting foreign elements or maintaining relations with Pakistan.

He stressed that Afghan nationals are



involved in terrorist incidents by crossing into Pakistan from Afghanistan territory.

The early repatriation of illegal Afghan residents in Pakistan, he emphasized, is of utmost importance.

The Prime Minister declared that the people of Pakistan completely reject politics and misleading narratives on the issue of terrorism.

He further stated that anyone facilitating or sympathizing with

foreign elements and India's terrorist proxies is complicit and will be dealt with in the language they deserve.

He added that the courageous people of Pakistan, particularly of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa,

stand united with the state and the armed forces against India's proxy networks like a solid wall of defense.

The Prime Minister assured that all necessary administrative

and legal measures will be taken immediately to ensure a more effective response to terrorism.

The Prime Minister and the Field Marshal also visited the injured at Bannu CMH.

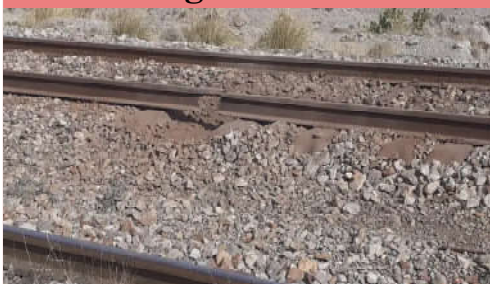
The Corps Commander Peshawar gave a detailed briefing on the security situation in the area.

Rs 840 Million Drinking Water Scheme in Chagai Sabotaged by Unknown Miscreants

Riaz Baloch: In a major blow to public welfare, unidentified miscreants set fire to the pipeline of a drinking water supply project worth Rs 840 million in Chagai district. The scheme was launched to provide thousands of households with clean drinking water at their doorstep, a facility the region's residents had long been deprived of.

Officials from the Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) said the project was the first of its kind in the area and its sabotage amounted to hostility against the people, as it was de-

signed to resolve a decades-old shortage of potable water.

Authorities confirmed that damage assessments are underway to determine repair costs, and the govern-

ment has directed immediate restoration efforts to minimize hardship for locals. Police have launched a full-scale investigation and vowed to bring those responsible to justice. Resi-

dents, expressing anger and disappointment, demanded swift arrests and strict punishment, stressing that no one should be allowed to undermine vital public projects.



Uzma Yaqoob Hails Balochistan's First Transgender Policy as Landmark Step for Inclusion

News Desk: ISLAMABAD: The approval of Balochistan's first-ever Transgender Policy has been praised as a groundbreaking move toward social inclusion and equal rights. Uzma Yaqoob, Head of the Forum for Dignity Initiatives (FDI) Pakistan, described the decision of

Chief Minister Sarfraz Bugti and his cabinet as historic, noting that it will create long-term opportunities for marginalized communities across the province.

Yaqoob emphasized that the new policy will enable transgender individuals to access education, employment, and so-

cial development programs, helping them play a more active role in society. She highlighted that civil society had long called for such a framework, while also pointing to earlier government initiatives such as scholarships for minorities and transgender persons as signs of commitment to inclusive

governance. Calling it a precedent for other provinces, Yaqoob urged effective implementation to ensure the benefits reach deserving groups. She further assured that FDI Pakistan will actively support the provincial government in carrying the policy forward.

35 terrorists killed, 12 soldiers martyred in K-P IBOs: ISPR

NEWS DESK: Twelve soldiers were martyred and 35 terrorists linked to the Indian-sponsored Fina al Khwarj network were killed in two separate intelligence-based operations conducted in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa between September 10 and 13, the military's media wing reported on Saturday.

According to the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), the first operation took place in Bajaur district following reports of terrorist presence. "Own troops effectively engaged the location, and after an intense exchange of fire, 22 militants were killed," the statement said.

In a separate encounter in South Waziristan district, 13 more terrorists were "neutralised" by security forces. The army confirmed that 12 per-



sonnel "fought gallantly, paid the ultimate sacrifice and embraced shahadat (martyrdom)." Weapons and ammunition were recovered from the terrorists, who, the military said, had been involved in multiple attacks in the region. The ISPR added that intelligence reports indicated the physical

involvement of Afghan nationals in recent attacks, stressing that "the use of Afghan soil against Pakistan by terrorists remains a grave concern."

"Pakistan expects the interim Afghan government to uphold its responsibilities and deny the use of its soil for terrorist activities against Pakistan," the statement said.

Over 100 dead as Punjab reels from devastating floods

NEWS DESK: At least 101 people have died in Punjab due to widespread flooding, officials said, as more than 4,700 villages and around 4.57 million residents have been affected across the province. Relief Commissioner Nabeel Javed of the Punjab Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) said on Saturday that about 2.51 million people had been relocated to safer areas.

According to a PDMA report on flood damages, the Chenab River inundated 2,489 villages, while the Sutlej and Ravi rivers affected 701 and 1,458 villages respectively.

In Rajanpur, Deputy Commissioner Shahgullah Mushtaq confirmed that the Head Panjnad flood surge had merged into the Indus River at Kot Mithan, where high-level flooding continues. Floodwaters entered the Kacha (riverine belt) areas, prompting the evacuation of remaining residents. Authorities have been making public announcements urging people to move immediately to relief camps.

In Jalalpur Pirwala, water levels have started to recede at the breaching point, but the Motorway Interchange remains closed. Many residents have taken shelter near the motorway on a self-help basis. The breach in the Uch Sharif Highway submerged more than 10 villages, displacing thousands, while water levels have also begun to fall at the Jalalpur public embankment.

At Head Muhammad Wala, water levels of the



Chenab continued to decline, easing pressure on the Shershah Bridge. Near Tehsil Alipur, the inflow and outflow at Head Panjnad was recorded at 575,195 cusecs. More than 100 villages were inundated, including Marh Shah, Choki Gabol, Seepur, Khairpur Sadat, Khangarh Doema, and Sultanpur, though Alipur city was spared.

Senior Minister Marriyum Aurangzeb and Federal Parliamentary Secretary Amir Talal Gopang visited affected areas and directed authorities to accelerate evacuation efforts. Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz Sharif is

expected to visit on Monday.

In Vehar, flood levels in the Sutlej have fallen, but large-scale relief operations remain urgently needed. In Muzaffargarh, the Chenab's level at Shershah Bridge has remained steady for days at 392.70 ft, just below the 395 ft high flood gauge. Low-lying areas remain under 6-8 feet of water.

Authorities reported outbreaks of epidemic diseases, including stomach infections and skin rashes. In Bahawalpur, floodwaters engulfed Fatu Wali Goth and Ghani Samma Sutha Road, leaving hundreds stranded. Families with children and livestock have been forced into relief camps after entire settlements were washed away by the Sutlej flood surge.

The PDMA reported that an extremely high-level flood was passing through Panjnad with a discharge of 575,000 cusecs. At Head Muhammad Wala, the water level stood at 410.5 ft against the high flood mark of 417.5 ft, while at Shershah Bridge the flow was 392.7 ft against the danger level of 393.5 ft. The PDMA said water levels at both points are expected to fall significantly within 48 hours.

On the Ravi, a medium-level flood of 57,000 cusecs was recorded at Head Sadhna, while the Sutlej experienced low-level flooding with 83,000 cusecs at Ganda Singh Wala and 87,000 cusecs at Sulemanki.

The PDMA also highlighted reservoir levels, noting that Mangla Dam is 93% full and Tarbela Dam has reached capacity, while India's Bhakra, Pong, and Thein dams were at 88%, 94%, and 89% capacity respectively.

Normal flows were reported at Marala, Qadirabad (61,000 cusecs), Trimmu (108,000 cusecs), Shahdara (31,000 cusecs), and Jassar (12,000 cusecs), as well as Khanki (68,000 cusecs). Bloks Headworks registered 48,000 cusecs, with a low-level flood.

The PDMA said river flows across Punjab are gradually returning to normal as rains have stopped in the upper catchment areas.

Tarbela Dam's water level stood at 1,550.00 ft, holding 5.728 million acre-feet, while Mangla recorded 1,235.95 ft with 6.8 million acre-feet.

Wasim Akram tells Pakistan, India to forget noise and 'enjoy' Asia Cup clash

DUBAI (INP): Pace bowler great Wasim Akram has urged Pakistan and India's cricketers to ignore the noise and enjoy the game when they meet in a highly charged Asia Cup T20 match on Sunday.

The Group A match in Dubai is the first clash on the cricket field between the countries since a military conflict four months ago took relations between the two to a new low. Neighbours to their lowest point in decades, India resisted calls to boycott the match between the pair, who have not played in any bilateral series since deadly attacks in Mumbai 2008.

"Enjoy, it's a game of cricket," legendary left-armers Akram told AFP of the match, which potentially could be the first of three high-octane meetings between the countries in the T20 tournament.

"Forget about everything other than cricket. One team will win, and one team will lose," he said.

"Just enjoy the moment if you win the game. Pressure will come, enjoy that and

show discipline because this is just a game. It's for both teams and for both sets of fans." A full house of 25,000 is expected at the Dubai International Cricket Stadium and Akram recalled how he thrived in such pressure situations during his 19-year international career.

"I enjoyed every level of Pakistan's 1987 tour during which the two countries did players from the opposition," said Akram, who led a Pakistan touring team to India in 1999 despite threats from extremists.

The 59-year-old was also part of Pakistan's 1987 tour during which the two countries came close to war.

Akram advised an inexperienced Pakistan team to think of the bigger picture and not get carried away by the hype of playing T20 world champions and arch-rivals India.

"Pakistan have a chance as they won a tri-series last week," said Akram, referring to T20 series with Afghanistan and the UAE.

"They should not think that we just need to win against India, that of winning the Asia Cup," he said.

Pakistan warns India against weaponizing, politicizing water issue

NEW YORK (INP): Pakistan's Permanent Representative to the United Nations Ambassador Asim Iftikhar Ahmad said that Pakistan has warned of India's unilateral actions to undermine the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) that pose not only a threat to Pakistan's water security but also endanger regional peace and global trust in international agreements.

Speaking at a high-level event organized by Pakistan's Mission to the United Nations in collaboration with the Muslim American Leadership Alliance (MALA) at the UN Headquarters on Friday, Ambassador Asim Iftikhar Ahmad delivered a powerful address.

"Indus Waters Treaty and Pakistan's Water Crisis Challenges, and the Way Forward," "Water security has become one of the defining challenges of our times. For Pakistan, this is an existential reality,

one that affects our economy, our society, and the survival of our people," said Ambassador Asim Iftikhar Ahmad.

He emphasized that the Indus River system remains the lifeline of Pakistan, with nearly 80% of its cultivated land dependent on it.

Ambassador Ahmad expressed deep concern over India's recent move to place the Indus Waters Treaty in abeyance, calling it a "grave violation of international law."

"The Treaty remains legally intact. Recent rulings by the Permanent Court of Arbitration in June and August 2025 reaffirmed its continuing validity and binding dispute-resolution mechanisms. No party has the authority to unilaterally suspend or abandon this agreement," he asserted.

He warned that undermining the Treaty has far-reaching humanitarian consequences.

"The recent floods in Pakistan were com-

pounded by the denial of timely data sharing, a clear treaty obligation. The absence of critical information turned a natural disaster into a humanitarian tragedy," the Ambassador said.

He strongly denounced the politicization of water, saying, "To treat water as an instrument of political leverage is to deny people their most fundamental human right. Water must never be weaponized. This is Pakistan's position." He added that water scarcity in Pakistan directly impacts public health, food and nutrition, and the livelihoods of millions, particularly the vulnerable, including women and children.

Ambassador Ahmad further cautioned that India's actions undermine not just Pakistan's security, but also the stability of South Asia and the global framework of transboundary water management.
