## Quetta to Host International Climate Change and AI Conference, Balochistan Governor Announces

**News Desk:**

An international conference on Climate Change and Artificial Intelligence (AI) will soon be held in Quetta, Balochistan Governor Jaffar Khan Mandokhail announced on Wednesday, saying the event will bring together leading scientists, United Nations representatives, and global experts to address some of the world's most pressing challenges.

Speaking during a meeting with BUTEMS Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Khalid Hafeez at the Governor House, the governor said the Balochistan University of Information Technology, Engineering and Management Sciences (BUTEMS) has the expertise and institutional capacity to host a world-class conference on climate change.

He said the proposed event would be aligned with the United Nations Decade on Ecosystem Restoration (2021-2030), creating opportunities for international collaboration in climate research, environmental protection, and technological innovation.

Describing climate change as a challenge that threatens humanity's future rather than just an environmental issue, Governor Mandokhail stressed the need for joint global efforts to restore ecosystems and develop practical solutions through research and innovation.

The governor also underlined the growing gap between the number of university gradu-

ates and available employment opportunities in Pakistan. He said governments must focus on creating new avenues for educated youth by encouraging public-private partnerships, promoting entrepreneurship, and introducing market-oriented education.

He said public-sector universities should equip students with modern skills that meet the demands of an evolving global economy.

As part of this effort, students at the BUTEMS Zhob Campus will receive laptops under the Prime Minister's Laptop Scheme to strengthen their digital learning, research, and innovation capabilities.

Governor Mandokhail urged BUTEMS to continue expanding its academic programs in emerging technologies, including Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Machine Learning, Robotics, Intelligent Systems, and Applied Mathematics, to prepare graduates for future careers and international job markets.

He said universities should play a central role in addressing societal challenges by producing research, developing innovative solutions, and contributing to sustainable economic growth.

The governor also praised Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Khalid Hafeez and his team for improving the university's academic standards and said continued reforms would help transform BUTEMS into a globally recognized institution for science, technology, and innovation.

## Horroric Bus Crash Near Balochistan-KP Border Leaves 40 Dead, 8 Injured

ZHOB: A devastating traffic accident near the border of Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) has claimed at least 40 lives and left eight others seriously injured. The tragedy occurred on Friday when a Peshawar-bound passenger bus veered off the road and plunged into a deep ravine near the Dana Sar area of Sherani district.

According to official sources, the vehicle had just crossed the provincial boundary into KP's Dera Ismail Khan district when the driver lost control.

**Mid-Journey Passenger Increase**

The bus originally departed from Quetta carrying 36 passengers, according to Sherani Deputy Commissioner Wali Khan Kakar.

However, the passenger count rose significantly midway through the journey after the vehicle picked up stranded travelers from another broken-down bus along the highway.

A spokesperson for the KP Rescue 1122 service confirmed that a total of 48 people were on board at the time of the fatal plunge.

Emergency Response and Rescue Efforts

Following directives from Balochistan Chief Minister Sarfraz Bugti, a massive joint rescue operation was launched.

Emergency teams from both provinces, including Rescue 1122

and Zhob emergency services, rushed to the remote site to pull survivors and victims from the wreckage.

Casualties: 40 fatalities have been confirmed so far.

The injured: Eight survivors were rescued from the ravine and rushed to the District Headquarters (DHO) Hospital in Zhob for urgent medical treatment.

Victim Recovery: The bodies of the deceased were initially taken to a local rural health center before being shifted to the Zhob DHO Hospital.

Shahid Rind, the Balochistan Chief Minister's aide for media and political affairs, stated that district administrations

from both Balochistan and KP are actively collaborating to manage the aftermath of the di-

aster.

He added that a formal investigation will be launched immediately to determine the exact cause of the crash.

Governor Expresses Deep Grief

Taking to social media platform X, Balochistan CM Sarfraz Bugti expressed his profound sorrow over the massive loss of life and offered his heartfelt condolences to the grieving families.

"The Balochistan government stands firmly with the affected families during this incredibly painful time," Bugti said.

He added that authorities have been instructed to ensure the highest quality of medical care for

the survivors and to provide comprehensive logistical support to the victims' relatives.

## Major Breakthrough: Suspects Confess to Murder of Kabul Jan Hotel Owner Hashim Noorzai in Quetta

QUETTA: In a major development, three suspects have confessed to the murder of prominent local businessman Mohammad Hashim Noorzai, the owner of Quetta's famous Kabul Jan Hotel.

Senior police officials confirmed that the motive behind the high-profile assassination stems from professional jealousy and a deep-seated business dispute.

The three suspects, residents of Satellite Town, Quetta, were quietly taken into custody three days ago during a targeted investigation.

Law enforcement agencies have also successfully recovered the vehicle used in the attack.

During interrogation, the suspects cracked and formally admitted to plotting and executing the assassination of the young entrepreneur.

**Jealousy and Business Dispute Cut Short a Young Life**

According to a senior investigator, the brutal killing was not a random act of street crime.



"When questioned about the motive, the suspects confessed that intense professional jealousy and an ongoing

business rivalry drove them to commit the crime," the officer stated.

"They explicitly targeted a

young, energetic businessman who was rapidly scaling his business operations."

Hashim Noorzai was a

highly respected figure in Quetta's commercial landscape, recognized not only for his popular restaurant on Air-

port Road but also for his active involvement in the Afghan transit trade.

Friends and colleagues remember him as a vibrant, hardworking individual whose sudden death has deeply shaken the local trading community.

**The Ambush at BALELI BYPASS**

The tragic incident occurred on the morning of June 27. Noorzai was traveling from Kuchlak to Quetta when his vehicle was intercepted near the Baleli Bypass.

Unidentified gunmen opened fire on his car, killing him on the spot before fleeing the scene. The brazen daytime attack sparked immediate outrage, prompting local traders and family members to stage a large-scale protest on the National Highway, demanding swift justice.

The intense pressure led to the formation of a special police team, resulting in the successful tracing and arrest of the suspects within days.

With detailed confessions secured and the getaway vehicle in police custody, authorities are finalizing the case file to present the suspects before the court.

Hub DC Orders Strict Enforcement of LPG Prices, Sets Retail Rate at Rs280 per Kg

HUB: Deputy Commissioner Hub, Captain (Retd.) Juma Dad Mandokhail, has directed authorities to ensure the uninterrupted supply of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) at government-approved prices, warning that strict legal action will be taken against companies and retailers charging above the notified rates.

Chairing a meeting with LPG marketing companies and retailers after meeting, participants unanimously agreed on revision of LPG prices. The new wholesale price has been fixed at Rs250 per kilogram, while the retail price has been set at Rs280 per kilogram.

The meeting also decided that any future reduction in LPG prices must be fully transferred to consumers without delay, ensuring that the public benefits from lower market rates. Captain (Retd.) Mandokhail warned that strict action would be taken against anyone violating the official pricing policy. Penalties may include sealing shops and company premises, as well as the cancellation of their No Objection Certificates (NOCs).

The deputy commissioner further directed all LPG marketing companies and shopkeepers to strictly comply with the government-approved price list to ensure immediate and genuine relief for the public. Following detailed discussions during the meeting, participants unanimously agreed on revision of LPG prices. The new wholesale price has been fixed at Rs250 per kilogram, while the retail price has been set at Rs280 per kilogram.
