## KP cabinet okays health policy to 'strengthen governance, accountability'

## Balochistan Apex Committee: PM Shehbaz Sharif, Field Marshal Asim Munir Reaffirm Unified Counterterrorism Strategy

QUETTA: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Thursday announced that Pakistan's civil and military leadership has adopted a unified strategy to intensify counterterrorism efforts following the recent security incidents in Balochistan.

Chairing a high-level meeting of the Balochistan Apex Committee under the National Action Plan (NAP) in Quetta, the Prime Minister said the government would utilize all available resources to combat terrorism, strengthen national security, and maintain peace and stability across the province.

The meeting was attended by Field Marshal Syed Asim Munir, Balochistan Chief Minister Mir Sarfraz Bugti, Governor Jaffar Khan Mandokhail, senior military commanders, intelligence officials, and key members of the federal and provincial governments.

Addressing the committee, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said Pakistan's political and military leadership had jointly reaffirmed its commitment to eliminating terrorism through coordinated action and institutional cooperation.

The Apex Committee reviewed the overall security situation in Balochistan, ongoing intelligence-based operations (IBOs), border security, intelligence coordination, and measures to strengthen law enforcement capabilities.

The Prime Minister said security forces launched immediate operations following the recent attacks, adding that 54 militants were neutralized during intelligence-led operations conducted in response to the violence.

He emphasized that counterterrorism operations would continue with full deter-

mination, stating that efforts against militant networks would remain uninterrupted while ensuring frontline security forces receive all necessary administrative and operational support.

**Focus on Regional Security Challenges**  
During the meeting, the Prime Minister discussed broader regional security concerns, including cross-border militancy and external challenges affecting Pakistan's internal security environment. He reiterated the government's commitment to protecting national interests and preventing any attempt to destabilize the country.

According to the briefing presented during the session, the recent attacks were aimed at disrupting peace, undermining investor confidence, and affecting ongoing economic development initiatives, including strategic infrastructure projects.

**CPB-Military Unity Against Terrorism**  
The Chief Minister paid tribute to the officers and personnel of the armed forces, police, Levies, FC, and intelligence agencies who have sacrificed their lives in the fight against terrorism. He said the nation's martyrs remain a symbol of courage, and their sacrifices have played a vital role in preserving Pakistan's peace, stability, and national security.

Bugti stressed that terrorist groups and their facilitators are enemies of Balochistan's development, prosperity, and national unity. He vowed that no leniency would be shown toward such elements and that legal action against them would continue with full force.

He further noted that the people of Balochistan have consistently rejected terrorism and extremism and will continue to stand alongside Pakistan's armed forces and law enforcement agencies in the fight against militancy.

## South-West Asia and the War Against Narcotics: Where Does Pakistan Stand?

**By Dr. B. Sultan:** Lady Macbeth once remarked that "a little water clears us of this deed" after the assassination of the King. Yet, with time, she remained haunted, obsessively rubbing her hands in an attempt to cleanse the imagined stains of blood. The persistence of narcotics production and trade in South-West Asia resembles this unending struggle—a dark reality that cannot be easily washed away.

Afghanistan has long been recognized as the world's largest producer of opium, with its roots tracing back to the early 1900s. Over the decades, the repercussions of this industry spilled into neighboring Pakistan and Iran.

In the late 2000s, Taliban leader Mullah Omar imposed a strict ban on poppy cultivation through threats, forced eradication, and severe punishments. However, as revealed by the UNODC Opium Survey 2007, the ban primarily targeted cultivation while the trade continued. After the fall of the Taliban, opium again became a major source of funding for logistics, weapons, and militia payments.

In 2022, the Taliban leadership once again announced a ban on poppy cultivation, with Hibatullah Akhundzada officially declaring significant reductions. Some



Western reports, supported by satellite imagery, showcased declining poppy fields in southern Afghanistan. However, this raises critical questions: Can Afghanistan realistically abandon such a central economic resource while facing sanctions? And what consequences does this shift have for Pa-

kistan? While certain international outlets hastily claim that Pakistan has become a new hub for narcotics, such narratives ignore key realities.

The issue is not a simple matter of "shifting sands" but a complex regional security challenge.

The porous border between Pakistan and

Afghanistan, coupled with cross-border networks of drug traffickers, means temporary shifts in cultivation are often strategic rather than permanent. Moreover, Afghanistan's pivot towards methamphetamine production — highlighted by satellite evidence of expanded ephedra processing

hubs — reflects adaptive strategies of traffickers rather than genuine eradication.

In Pakistan, however, the situation is markedly different. Since 2001, the country has largely maintained its "poppy-free" status, despite sporadic spillovers from Afghanistan.

Following the

Taliban's 2022 ban, some illicit cultivations did emerge in border areas.

In Pakistan, particularly within Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Yet, these were swiftly addressed through Pakistan's Poppy Elimination Campaign (PEC-2025).

This multi-agency effort, led by the Anti-

Narcotics Force (ANF) and provincial administrations, successfully destroyed thousands of acres of illegal poppy fields.

Over 250 FIRs were registered, dozens of arrests were made, and awareness campaigns were launched across educational institutions.

Importantly, inde-

pendent surveys after March 2025 confirmed the effectiveness of these eradication drives.

Pakistan's determination to combat narcotics often remains under-reported internationally, overshadowed by outdated or selective portrayals.

The fact remains: Pakistan continues to fight this menace not only for its own stability but also for global security.

What is urgently needed is greater recognition of these efforts by the international community and enhanced cooperation from agencies such as the UNODC.

As South-West Asia remains at the heart of global narcotics trade routes, Pakistan's role is both frontline and decisive. Balochistan, in particular, holds the potential to transform from a vulnerable transit zone into a hub of opportunity, stability, and resilience.

Just as Lady Macbeth's imagined guilt could not be washed away with water,

the global community cannot absolve itself of responsibility by ignoring Pakistan's sacrifices and achievements in this ongoing struggle.

The fight against narcotics requires collective recognition, support, and action — not selective narratives.

At least 64 deportees from Libya convicted in 3 Punjab districts after summary trial

NEWS DESK: At least 64 deportees from Libya belonging to the Gujranwala region have been convicted by local courts after summary trial in cases lodged against them by the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) in its three circles of the region.



The deportees were handed 10-15 days' imprisonment on average. The courts of special judges (central) in three districts additionally imposed fines of Rs25,000-50,000 on them after they confessed to illegally crossing the international borders.

As per the court decisions, the period of their judicial custody — between 10 and 15 days — has also been considered to count towards their imprisonment, and they were released after the payment of their imposed fines.

A senior FIA official told Dawn that at least 200 illegal Pakistani migrants had been captured by the Libyan authorities during their bid to board boats heading to Italy. After remaining in the captivity of Libyan authorities for a couple of weeks, he said the illegal immigrants were brought to Pakistan on two special flights with the assistance of the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) around a month ago.

At least 90 of the 200 deportees were from

the Gujranwala region, where the FIA's circles Gujranwala, Gujrat and Sialkot districts had lodged the cases against them. The deportees were detained by the respective FIA circles and their cases were sent to the courts concerned in these cities.

Official sources

said the summary trial of 26 remaining deportees was underway in different courts, and a decision was expected in the next few days.

They further said that so far a sum of about Rs1.05 million had been received as a fine from the convicted deportees.

FIA Gujranwala Zone Director Muhammad Bin Ashraf told Dawn that the agency has put the names of these deportees on immigration's passport control list (PCL) as a result of which they will be unable to travel abroad for at least five years.

He added that a record ratio of convictions in the illegal human trafficking and immigration cases had been witnessed during the last six months in the region, with 172 people convicted by the courts during that period.

He highlighted that between January 1 and July 8, courts had awarded up to 22 years of imprisonment and imposed fines totalling Rs13.7m.

GB's top court disqualifies PPP's candidate for concealing assets

NEWS DESK: The Gilgit-Baltistan Supreme Appellate Court on Thursday disqualified PPP candidate Fida Muhammad Nashad for concealing his assets in his nomination papers, setting aside the GB Chief Court's decision that had allowed him to contest the elections.

Nashad's nomination papers were initially



rejected by the returning officer (RO), prompting him to challenge the decision before the election tribunal. The tribunal, however, upheld the RO's decision. Subsequently, Nashad challenged the tribunal's verdict in the GB Chief Court, which allowed him to contest the elections.

The Form 47 issued by the GB Election Commission after the recent general elections in June had declared Nashad returned candidate from constituency GBA-09 Skardu-III.

However, his opponent, Zakir Hussain, had challenged his eligibility to become a member of the assembly before the GB Supreme Appellate Court.

the decision of the case. After hearing arguments from both sides, Justice Shamim issued a verdict in the case on Thursday, disqualifying Nashad from holding a seat in the assembly from GBA-09 Skardu-III. He also heard the Election Commission's representatives and examined revenue records.

After examining the records and revenue documents, the region's apex court found that Nashad had concealed details of his assets in the nomination papers submitted for contesting the elections from GBA-09 Skardu-III.

In its verdict, the court declared the GB Chief Court's order dated May 25, 2026, "null and void" and upheld the decision of the election tribunal.

Justice Shamim maintained that the election tribunal had rightly disqualified Nashad under Article 62(1)(f) of the Constitution of Pakistan for concealing assets, making false statements and violating mandatory provisions of the Election Act.

He added that the GB Chief Court, without any sound legal reason, had allowed the writ petition against the election tribunal's final decision and set aside its order.
